

Psychological Interventions by School Psychologist

What are some of the reasons for referring a learner?

- Acting out behaviour in class
- Bullying
- Being bullied
- A recent bereavement that the learner is struggling with
- A traumatic event
- A sudden, unexplainable drop in academic performance
- Suspecting emotional, physical or sexual abuse of the learner
- Inappropriate behaviour with classmates or teachers
- Sudden changes in the home environment (divorce, remarriage, birth of a sibling, etc.)
- Feelings of depression or suicidal thoughts

Who can refer a learner for psychological interventions?

- Teachers
- Parents
- Another staff member (librarian, receptionist, etc.)
- Learners can refer themselves

How do teachers or other staff members refer a learner?

- Teachers and other staff members are required to complete a referral form. This form is found in Frau Froschauer's pigeon hole and can also be e-mailed upon request. For learners younger than 14 years of age parental consent needs to be obtained. If there is some reason why this cannot be done it should be discussed confidentially with Frau Froschauer.
- Parents can refer their child by contacting Frau Froschauer directly.
- Learners can refer themselves by speaking with Frau Froschauer directly.
